

Pastor's reflections

I've been thinking of scales a great deal lately. No, I don't mean the kind in your bathroom or the kind on fish or snakes, but rather the kind also called a balance. If you can, picture the image often called "Blind Justice." She often stands outside courthouses; she holds a scale, a balance which must be perfectly level, to show that no favoritism is found in the court system. Such favoritism would lead to injustice.

That desire for a healthy balance in various aspects of life goes beyond just our courts. In so many things, we humans need to find the right balance to thrive: a balance between: confidence and humility, work and family, and what I have been thinking about most, old and new.

I daily thank God to be the pastor of Wesley United Methodist Church. This church has much love, great generosity, and a smooth operation. Now we aren't perfect: no person or group of people is, but there is much here that is life-giving and shows God's love through Jesus Christ. When things are going well, we don't need to fix what isn't broken. In some ways we need to stay the course because we are on the right path with the Holy Spirit of God as our guide.

However, God does not call us to never change. The witness of the scriptures shows people changing and following God in new ways: moving from slavery to freedom, from wandering to settlement, from sin to mercy, from sickness to wholeness, and from death to life. Wesley United Methodist Church will need to change things from time to time to live out our calling from God to follow Jesus. Sometimes the change will be easy: for instance, before you get this newsletter, we probably will have changed a back-up battery in one of our exit signs.

We need to stay on God's path for us, and that might mean a few changes of direction as the path weaves forward around obstacles, or as the path goes in a new way to better connect with people who need love in Jesus's name. We will need to make some changes, but we also want to continue to do that which bears fruit in His Name. Our visioning day was a start, but each of us is called to help us all follow God's way. So, lets stay in balance, and in so doing, best serve God and share the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Ash Wednesday

For more than 1000 years Christians have gathered each year on Ash Wednesday for worship to mark the start of the holy season of Lent. Lent is the 40 days before Easter (not counting Sundays). On these days, followers of Christ are invited to seek to grow in faith, to consider how God is asking them to transform their lives for the better, and finally to live out the calling to bless others that Christ gives us through the Holy Spirit.

We will have an Ash Wednesday worship here at the church starting at 7:00 PM. The service will be a bit different.

Prayer stations will invite us to turn our hearts to God. We will have a time of music. We will have a time of confession. Finally we will have the imposition of ashes, in which we are marked with the sign of the cross as a remembrance of our need for God's Grace and also to remember we are loved by God. Some of our confirmation students will be helping Pastor Jeremiah lead worship.

Join us for a different sort of service in which you are called toward God in a multiple ways, so that we can remember what a difference and blessed change Christ can make in our lives.

Upcoming Worship Services

We are nearing a change in the season. No, I don't mean that spring is coming early; in the seasons of the church year, we are nearing a change as we enter Lent: a time to prepare our hearts and minds to remember the Last Supper, Jesus's crucifixion, and most of all the joy of Jesus's resurrection on the first Easter. This season change will come in the middle of the month, so our new sermon series will begin on February 18th.

- February 4: This will be the final sermon in our "Faithful Resolutions" series. Through an examination of Psalm 84, we will consider why God calls us to worship with our church family each week.
- February 11: Our guest preacher will be Rev. Megan Thompson, my best friend and lovely wife. For many years, Megan and I designate a Sunday near Valentine's Day to "send our love" to each other's congregations. We do a pulpit exchange, so each of our congregations can get to know our spouse better. Join Megan as she talks about her call to ministry. Don't miss her sermon; she's a fantastic preacher!
- February 18: For Lent we will start a new sermon series called "Being a Disciple." To be a disciple means to follow Jesus. In ancient times people who wished to be baptized as adults and become Christians would use the time of Lent to learn more about what it meant be a disciple, a Christ follower. As our guide for this sermon series, we will look at two of Jesus's sermons, the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew and the Sermon on the Plain in Luke. To start off, we will consider what Jesus teaches us about "right and holy" relationships with God and with our fellow human beings.
- February 25: "Being a Disciple" continues as we look at how Jesus asks us to live our faith in a way that is humble and invites others to follow Him.

Sign Up for the Lenten Study!

Our church wide Lenten study will be Adam Hamilton's powerful 24 Hours that Changed the World. This book and DVD study looks at the last day of Jesus's earthly life and was filmed on location in and around Jerusalem and other sites in the Holy Land.

This book and video ask us to consider what God is saying to us through each of the major events in this final day that Christ, God's Word in the Flesh, walked before His resurrection. In looking at events like the Last Supper, Jesus praying in the garden, Jesus's arrest, the crucifixion, and finally Christ conquering death, we see the powerful love of God and the signs that through Christ, God is making all things new and better.

Four study groups will be meeting this Lent. Pastor Jeremiah will lead a group each Wednesday night at 7:00 at the church, starting February 14th (the first session will have a different start time as that is Ash Wednesday, but all other sessions will start at 7:00). At 2:00 PM on Thursdays, Sue Inks will lead a group at the church. On Thursdays at 6:30 PM, Nancy Pitsch will lead a group at the church, child care is secured for this evening session. Both of these groups will start meeting Thursday, February 15th. Finally, a group will be meeting with Pastor Jeremiah at the church on Sunday afternoons at 3:00 beginning on February 18th.

If you've not already done so, please sign up! In particular, we want to invite any of our youth from 6th grade on up to join the discussions as we read, talk, and with the Holy Spirit's help, learn and grow in faith.


