Pastor's Reflections

My vision had seemingly always been good. I remember reading the letters off the wall at the doctor's office as a kid. I guess I always got them right, or at least good enough because I went through elementary school with no glasses. Then something happened. My mom noticed in 7th grade my grades slipped, particularly in the class where I had to sit in the back and take notes the most. Then that summer we went out west. For years I had been the family navigator, but Mom and Dad noticed I didn't seem to be able to read road signs well. I was just looking through my eyes as I always had, and I didn't know anything was wrong. When we got back from vacation and before school started, they took me to the optometrist in Aledo, IL. Turned out, I needed glasses, big time! Suddenly my vision cleared, and in a real sense, I could see where I was going better than I had in years.

We need clear vision; it makes everything better. Now without clear vision we can still function; we can even see beauty and wonder. Even with my blurry vision that summer after 7th grade, I could see the beauty of the national parks in the West. However, maybe I missed something amazing because I couldn't see clearly.

On Saturday, January 20, from 9-1:30 (lunch and childcare provided) our congregation will have a visioning day. It will be a day for us to look to God to see where we are called to go for 2018 and perhaps beyond as a congregation. We are not doing this because we are blind and stumbling. On the contrary, much beauty in the love, faith, and discipleship of our congregation exists. However, without clear vision, it's possible we are missing something. It's possible we might miss the road sign, miss the turn, have to double-back wasting time and resources. We need to make sure our vision is clear; we need to look to the source of all wisdom and knowledge: God known to us through Christ Jesus.

Everyone from our church, junior high age and older, is invited to be part of our visioning. You don't need to be part of a church team or committee, you don't need to be a member; all we ask is if this is your church home and you are committed to helping this congregation serving Jesus Christ as we are called, join us for the conversation. We do ask that you sign up on the sign-up sheets in the Fellowship Hall, or email the church office with your RSVP. If you are one of our elected leaders on one of the teams or committees, please make every effort to be there.

Whether or not you will be able to attend, please be in prayer about the future of our congregation. Please seek God's guidance about what His vision is for us, how we can invite more in our community into relationship with God, and what needs we can best meet in our community. Bring your prayerful thoughts and reflections, maybe some notes, with you on the 20th. If you can't come, but have some reflections, please share them with Pastor Jeremiah or Jan Glover, our Lay Leader. We trust the Spirit of God speaks to all and inspires all. We need and desire your input!

One final point: You may or may not have heard about considerable debate about the future of the United Methodist Church. Some proposals that may significantly affect the future of our denomination are being prayerfully discussed. A plan for the future of our denomination is being formed and will be released in May of 2018. That plan, likely with some amending, will then be voted on by delegates from the United Methodist Church across the world in February 2019. Neither I nor any of our lay leadership know what will be in that plan, and how it might affect our congregation or lead to anything that might require our congregational action. Many within our denomination and our local congregation have very different understandings of many issues, particularly around acceptance of lesbian, gay, bi-sexual, and transgendered individuals in church pastoral or Episcopal (bishop) leadership. To use a phrase I've heard frequently over the years, "We are not of "one mind" on these questions."

Regardless of what happens with these discussions affecting our denomination, our congregation is called to serve Jesus Christ and spread the Good News of the Reign of God. God has a purpose for us here in Sterling-Rock Falls. As a congregation made up of many people of all ages, backgrounds, politics and understanding, I believe we are called to love God, follow Christ, and serve our neighbors. This day of visioning will hopefully be a time when God's plan for us comes into greater focus. May we pray for that vision!

Worship Services in January

As we start a New Year on the calendar and finish celebrating the Christmas season, we will begin a new sermon series: Faithful Resolutions. Each year many of us make New Year's resolutions: sometimes one, sometimes many, sometimes one we've never tried before, and sometimes one that we've tried over and over again. This year, let us consider what resolutions might not just help us get fitter in body or get our finances in order, but which can help us improve our relationship with God and with others. Join us through January and early February as we look at: Friendship in Christ, Prayer, Scripture Reading, Worship and how resolving to do these 4 things can open our lives to God's transforming love.

• January 7: Epiphany Sunday: Join us as we conclude the Christmas season with a look at the story of the Wise Men visiting Jesus, and what this story still has to say to us today; join us for "A Story of the King."

• January 14: Human Relations Sunday: As we start our new sermon series, Faithful Resolutions, we will remember our call as Christians to love all our neighbors. We will consider what it means to be "Friends in Christ."
