Playground coming to south lawn of church grounds

This summer, Wesley UMC will add a playground to its grounds.

The Christian Education team and the Trustees worked together to discuss our need and options for this project. The Administrative Council weighed in and ultimately approved this dream. And the church is graciously paying for the playground!

The playground will be installed

straight out from the south hallway doors (east of the gazebo), set back against the tree line. It will be completely fenced in, providing a safe area for our children. The ground will be covered and cushioned with colored rubber mulch, which will not blow away, fade, or splinter.

The playground will be delivered and installed by professionals. The fence will be installed by a local company. Land-

scape borders will be installed by volunteers from our church (at a time to be determined).

Finishing touches will include a bench and/or picnic table.
