## **Pastor's Reflections**

Tearing the Curtain

37Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. 38And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. Mark 15:37-38

In this season of Lent, we've been looking at the stories and teachings of Jesus' final week before his death in Jerusalem. I for-. got how much of the 4 gospels are accounts of this week. There is so much material it can be easy to miss some of the amazing things that happened that offer us so much hope. The passage above is one of those passages I think I've overlooked sometimes. Amid remembering Jesus' horrible death, in the joy of the resurrection we can fail to see the significance of just a few words in one verse, but they are significant, and full of hope.

In the temple in Jerusalem a curtain separated most of the temple from a specific room known as the Holy of Holies. This curtain was seen as protection to keep people from getting to close to the presence of God which it was believed would be fatal to them. Only rarely and only then with special preparations could one priest enter beyond this curtain. In a very real sense, and not necessarily for any sinful reason this curtain kept people from God. Yet we are told that the moment Jesus died that curtain tore in two from top to bottom. Symbolically God was demonstrating that God doesn't want to be distant from humanity but to be in relationship with all of us. That's good news!

So, I ask you this Month of April as we remember how the curtain was torn through Jesus' death and even more so his resurrection how can we tear some curtains open. Is there something you see that is keeping others from God, a curtain others have put up, a curtain you may have put up. How can you tear that down, who can help you do it? How can you help at least one other person see the love of God and just the tall curtain?

God help us to see the curtain is gone, and you love all of us, and help us to share that good news!!!

## **Meet Your Trustees**

Several people have asked me who is serving on trustees and what do trustees do. I hope this article will answer both of those questions. Nine individuals serve on the trustees' team. The term for each member is three years. The current slate of trustees are: Dave Fredericks, Michele Drew, and Rory Smith through December, 2019; Cory Canas, Jan Glover, and Curtis Greenfield through December, 2020; Steve Downes, Bill Parker, and Rebecca Tieman through December, 2021. Dave and Jan serve as co-chairs for the team. Steve acts as the recording secretary.

The trustees are responsible for the care and maintenance of both the church and the parsonage. Each Sunday they tidy up the sanctuary by picking up bulletins and trash, straightening the hymnals and Bibles, replacing prayer request forms and offering envelopes, collecting attendance sheets, and sharpening pencils. They fill the alter candles, replace light bulbs and spotlights, and unlock and lock the building before and after services. The work days in the spring and fall are organized by the trustees.

We have been blessed with many members of our congregation who assist the trustees with many of these tasks. Bob Allen and Reid and Ryan Blackburn climb the ladders to replace the lights in the sanctuary and the rose window. Barb Quick has a talent for adjusting the thermostats for the multitude of events held at our church. Andy Pitsch and Mike Drew along with our volunteer technicians keep our audio and visual systems functioning well.

Trustees oversee the care of the heating/cooling systems, electrical services, and plumbing issues. Frequently, we seek bids for work that needs to be accomplished in these areas. For example, this past year, we studied the causes for ice damming. The number one cause for this condition is a lack of insulation. Upon investigation, it was found that our building was sorely lacking in proper insulation. We were able to secure a company that offered a best solution that was economically feasible. The end result was a savings of \$1200 in gas costs as compared to the same two month time period one year ago! The payback on this investment will probably be three years or less.

Trustees hire companies for lawn care, snow removal, repairs and purchasing of new equipment such as appliances and floor coverings. The health and safety of our congregation is of utmost importance, so exit signs, emergency lighting, the defibrillator, fire extinguishers, and smoke detectors, are inspected and kept in working order.

Acting as a trustee for one year has made me so aware of all the effort that goes into making our church function at its best. I have gained so much knowledge through this experience. I am very impressed with the wonderful way our trustees have embraced the qualities needed for excellent leadership and teamwork. I extend a huge "thank you" to former trustees Douglas Brandau, Randy Clod-felter, Tracy DuRall, and Rita Smith who helped me learn how to be a trustee this past year.

I hope more of you will consider joining this great team when the next nominations' time arrives in the fall.
