

Pastor's Reflections

a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; (Ecclesiastes 3:7b)

Several days ago I was honored to do the funeral for Mrs. Alice Wiersema. Her family chose Ecclesiastes 3:1-8 as one of the scripture passages for her service. I thought back to this small part of that longer passage this week. Yesterday (I'm writing this on May 22), I was at the Clergy Day apart, which is the clergy session of the Northern Illinois Annual Conference. A part of this day is a presentation from a speaker, and they generally bring someone in to offer guidance on some aspect of pastoral ministry.

The speaker this year was from the Mennonite Peace Center, as you may be aware the Mennonite's are a known as a "Peace Church," meaning they do not believe in violence or war as legitimate means of problem solving. As such they provide their services to other Christian groups who are in conflict. This presenter was talking about how pastors can help lower tensions in times of conflict, or anxiety (for instance if a church had a fire or some other accident.)

I can't begin to cover all that he covered, but one of the things that struck me the most was his advice on how a leader (pastor or lay person) in a congregation can lower anxiety and stress in difficult times. Amongst those is never assigning blame, but rather focusing on how things can improve. As a leader here, I have sometimes, particularly in moments of stress, vocally given blame to others. I said what I thought without properly praying and thinking to make sure my words would help. Casting blame almost never helps anything, and I am deeply sorry for having done it, and for anyone I have hurt due to these actions. I want to do better and prayerfully need to do better in this area of my life, faith, and leadership.

Bolivia Mission Trip

The Gatz/Burke Bolivia Mission group is on the move again! We are planning a trip to LaPaz and Cochabamba late summer, with an option for extended time and cultural events. There is a retreat center in Cochabamba in need of maintenance and painting which will be the main project, but we will also be taking down needed medical and school supplies.

We will leave around July 29th and fly to La Paz. There will be a day to acclimatize to the altitude, and then we will travel to Cochabamba. After our project time, we will return to LaPaz, and then those wishing to come back then will fly out. Bolivian Independence Day is August 6th, and there are celebrations with parades, dancing, food, and other activities. Some will stay to take part in the festivities, and day trips may be possible before returning home about August 10th. Anyone wishing to join the trip can be part! It is very high altitude

Rev. Paul H. Lee



Various experiences of the past have shaped Rev. Paul H. Lee's faith journey: from progressive academic and conservative mission organization. While he is theologically progressive, his practice of faith and pastoral leadership is moderate with a deep understanding of the conservative.

Rev. Lee was born and raised in a faithful Christian family. He completed his first Master of Divinity in South Korea and served three churches as a youth pastor and an associate pastor since 1999. He was united in marriage with his wife, Rev. Rosa Y. Lee on Fool Day of 2006. They went to mission fields in South Africa and Zimbabwe in 2006. One year later, They came back to South Korea, and he worked at an institute for two years as a teacher and the Dean. And they moved into Big

Island, HI for another missionary experience in 2009. While staying in Hawaii, they went to India for a missionary project to teach the Bible (the Epistles of Apostle Paul, one semester) at OHAG Theological Seminary. Rev. Lees taught a group of Dalit pastors the knowledge of the Bible and got inspired by their love for God and passion for the church, the body of Christ.

In Hawaii, Rev. Lee became a Methodist (Kona United Methodist Church), and God unfolded a new chapter of his life with a lifelong calling. And he went to Garrett-Evangelical Theological Seminary for his second Master of Divinity and did an internship at the Chicago Temple. It was the season to learn more about beliefs, values, and history of the United Methodist Church. The six years of his ministry at Waterman UMC has been meaningful, effective, and fruitful. The church has been growing in both worship and mission with him, and he's been growing as well with the church.

Dear Wesley members and friends,

I wanted to take the time to invite all kids turning 4 before Sept. 1 through children entering sixth grade in the fall to Vacation Bible School at Wesley United Methodist Church this summer. Our theme this year is To Mars and Beyond. At VBS, your children will enjoy an interactive, energizing, Bible-based good time as they discover their strength in God. They will become voyagers and explore how to serve God and God's mission for their lives.

After a high-energy opening at To Mars and Beyond, the voyagers will make their way to the Bible Story Headquarters. Interactive Bible lessons will reveal Power Launchers to equip your voyagers for an active life with God. Your voyagers will discover a vector verse (Bible memory verse) that will remain with them in their faith long after VBS.

The students will expand on what they've discovered by participating in a variety of activities: making their own art projects at Craft Headquarters, singing new songs at Music Headquarters, playing games at Recreation Headquarters, and enjoying tasty treats at Snack Headquarters.
