At long last, the playground is finished! This project has taken two years to complete due to a number of unforeseen circumstances. Huge "thank yous" are in order to our volunteers! Tracy DuRall researched and sought bids on the equipment, fence, and mulch. Rory Smith dealt with the difficulties of the first incorrect installation of the equipment for almost a year.

Dave Fredericks wrestled the sod cutter and won! He moved the sod and helped plant it along the church foundation. Curt Greenfield brought a loader and helped to move the sod and level the ground. Bill Parker installed sod and assisted in laying landscaping fabric. Amy Lopez stained wood, arranged the landscaping fabric, and spread mulch. Mary Downes laid fabric and spread mulch. Randy Clodfelter loaned his trailer to Steve Downes, so he could bring in his tractor to move the mulch from the parking lot to the playground. Steve spent three hours moving mulch! Rory, Steve, and Andy Pitsch secured boards to the fence to hold the mulch in place.

We are so blessed to have so many talented and giving men and women in our church family!

Wesley UMC - 2019 Mission Trip to Mission, South Dakota



Early on Sunday, July 21, a group of twelve, headed out to Tree of Life Relief Ministry in Mission, SD. After some "bumps in the road", we arrived late at night and prepared for our work in the week to come. We split into two groups to tackle our different projects.


One group worked on Ed's Church remodeling two bathrooms, painting stairs and the outside windows and finishing an outdoor mural. We put in a lot of drywall, painted, repaired plumbing and put in new sub floor. Ed's church is used primarily for rehabilitation services and having facilities available is essential to their mission. We enjoyed getting to know Pastor Ed, Pat the next door neighbor and care taker and Pat's dogs Ben and Bear.

The other group worked with a family to convert what was basically a shed in a field into a tiny house for a family of three that would withstand a South Dakota winter. They wired the house for electricity including a breaker box, put in insulation, installed a back door and more windows, constructed stairs and put up paneling for the walls. The kids especially bonded with the son, Kaktus, who was like one of the group. Kaktus and his mom Lisa were working beside everyone by the end of the trip and when we left were fully prepared to finish the work that was left. The family is involved in rodeo and showed the kids bull riding, roping and let everyone ride their horses. Horses are a big part of Lakota culture so it was really special.

Some members of the group also visited the soup kitchen and thrift store to lend a hand.

We had a chance to attend several cultural events including pow wow dancing, meeting with the lineal chief Hollow Horn Bear who discussed the Lakota beliefs and a demonstration of ancient games. Most of us agreed, however, that the best cultural experiences were with the people we worked with in the community on a daily basis. On our "off day", we went to Wall Drug, Mt. Rushmore and explored Custer State Park including jumping into Sylvan Lake. We did include a stop at Menards into our "off day" so we could gather the supplies needed to finish our projects.

This trip was an amazing experience where we all learned a lot about ourselves, each other, another culture and grew in our faith. There were many moments throughout our journey where you could see God at work. We were all very grateful for the opportunity to serve the Tree of Life for the week. Thank you all for all of your donations, support and prayers throughout our journey.

We are the agents of ministry led by the Holy Spirit to share the love of Jesus with the hurting and point them to a Savior who loves them dearly. Our churches should always be places of safety and community for those wrestling with any issue, especially those involving mental health<mark>." *The Exchange with Ed Stetzer (adapted slightly*)</mark>


Mission Corner
