From Our Pastor



On the last Sunday of January, I mentioned about the furious storm that John Wesley encountered in the ship on the way to America. He was scared and terrified that he thought the ship was about to be broken and that he was going to die soon. But he found twenty-six German Moravians in the ship. Unlike Wesley, they were gathered to sing and praise God. I didn't go further in my sermon on that Sunday.

But the scene reminds me of Jesus and his disciples in a boat when they encountered a storm (Mark 4:33-41). His disciples were terrified, not knowing what to do. Probably, some of them were running here and there trying to help sailors. Some others were crying and screaming. I love Rembrandt H. van Rijn's painting, "the Storm on the Sea of Galilee." It helps picture what it might have been. It is so scary. But when they found him, Jesus was sleeping calm. And Jesus rather asked his disciples, "Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?"

The storm. It is a part of our lives. We have experienced many kinds of storms. Sometimes it would take place in a relationship with your beloved ones, family, relatives, or friends. It could happen in your work or with co-workers. It could be health issues. And it could happen to the church as well.

It is like a storm that disciples encountered in the boat. In this season, I want us to see Jesus, who calls us to calm and to see what Jesus would do. And actually, I think I see the light and hope that is coming. So, as I mentioned a few times, I want us to focus on our mission and our church as disciples of Jesus Christ and the body of Christ.

As we are having a sermon series on John Wesley, if I may summarize our Methodism in three words, those will be "Love," "Grace," and "Humility." These three words are manifested in all of his powerful sermons and ministries, and penetrate the core of the Methodist doctrines. We had three sermons on John Wesley, the Founder of the Methodist Movement: his childhood, education, and yearning for purity, as well as his failure, rejection, and pain. And we will continue the series in February. And the rest of the sermon series will be about the critical belief of what we may learn from John Wesley: Grace and our calling. Let's find the lessons we need in our lives and in our times. And I believe it is perfectly God's time for us to have Lent starting at the end of the month, which claims us to self-examine and repent. May God speak to us, give the wisdom to understand, and courage to respond to God's calling, and strength to live by God's will. Amen.

Everyday Disciples: John Wesley's 22 Questions. "FOR CHILDREN" revised by Nancy Pitsch

During January worship "Matthew Meetings" for children, we've introduced John Wesley, the founder of our Wesley United Methodist Church, his Holy Club, and the 22 Questions it's members would ask/answer everyday!

"In 1729, while John Wesley was a student at Oxford, he started a club with his brother Charles. It was a private club and It was soon mockingly dubbed "<u>The Holy Club</u>" by some of his fellow collegians. The club members rigorously self-examined themselves everyday by asking the following 22 questions"

Look over the list; (some questions are left out; a bit too complicated for children. The questions below have been reworded so as to aid understanding for children) cut them apart, toss in a jar or baggie, and read one a day with your child(ren)! At dinner time, as part of bedtime routine, during a daily commute, or whenever there's "down time" for listening to your child's heart! I know you all have crazy schedules! But take a baggie full of these questions along with you; it may replace screen time while you're waiting in a restaurant, doctor's office, carline, or 10 minute pocket of time in the day!

Be sure to answer them yourselves as well; give your child (ren) the gift of hearing how you struggle/cope with making good choices and staying close to God's will for your life! Many of the questions may be new considerations for parents as well as children. John Wesley's questions of self-examination still speak directly into our lives and hearts as they did over 200 years ago to believers.

ENJOY - GROW with your child (ren) in the awareness of Christ "in whom we live, and move and have our being" Acts 17:28.
