


From Our Pastor...

John's Gospel During the Lenten Season





A movie, the Son of God starts with a man sitting alongside a lake, and he narrates, "In the beginning with the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God." (John 1:1-2) Yes, this person is John, who many believe wrote the Gospel of John.

All the other disciples were put to death while proclaiming the Good News. John was

the only one left alive until in his 80s. He has seen Jesus Christ with his eyes and touched him with his hands. He has witnessed all the other disciples and Christ's followers proclaiming the Good News. He has watched those people pass away, and he was one of the few who remained alive among those people. Then, he decides to write the Gospel to hand down to Jesus' followers in his time and us.

John's focus was not to deliver what had happened in detail, because there were already many writings and letters, and because it passed over a half-century from Jesus' resurrection. His primary focus was to proclaim who Jesus is, why he is Christ, the Messiah, and what it means to us.

We all know Jesus Christ, and we believe in him. Yet, I think he is also the One who appears in so many characters, as there are many colors of the Holy Spirit and forms of the beliefs we have.

Luther the Reformer once said, "Only a mad man doesn't doubt," and John Wesley said, "as to all opinions which do not strike at the root of Christianity, we think and let think." During the Lenten season, I invite all of us to have a chance to question and resonate with me. Let's read and think about who Jesus Christ is to us and what he wants us to be. I pray that it will be a meaningful sermon series that helps you to find your own answer to Jesus' asking, "who do you say that I am?"

As we begin the Lent, we move on to the meaning of being a Christian, reading, and meditating on the Gospel of John during this Lenten season. I want to encourage you to read and meditate on John's Gospel together. My hope and prayer are that each one of us finds the meaning to follow Jesus, knowing who he is, what he has done for us, and what he calls us to do and be. Amen.


Greeting Card Ministry Needs Your Help!

Lord, as we enter Lent help us to draw near to you in praise, stripping away all that distracts us from worship. **Amen**








