I want to talk about a little bit weird story. A couple of years ago, I had an issue with my crowns and bridge on my front teeth. It's been with me for

12 years. It was perfectly working like natural teeth of mine. I loved biting an apple as a whole. I loved steak. I enjoyed many kinds of nuts. But those have not been mine for a few months, while I had a temporary bridge. The inconvenience was not just about eating and biting something. I had to be very cautious when I spoke, sang, and preached, worrying about the bridge falling apart. With a temporary bridge, I try not to speak bold and aloud, because my tongue had to touch front teeth to pronounce most words, and the air which comes out of our mouth was so strong. It's very inconvenient.

This convenience helped me understand something for which I should be grateful. Yes, I'm saying that I'm grateful that I have my teeth. Actually, I haven't been thankful for my teeth before. I thought it is just there in my mouth. And I haven't appreciated them. I just took it for granted that teeth were strong enough to chew and bite that I wanted.

I'm thankful that I was reminded that there is nothing around me that I may take it for granted, especially in this Lenten season, in which we need to think about who we are and where we are in our faith journey and to reorient ourselves back to God. Then, I started counting the stuff that I'm using on a daily basis. There are countless kinds of stuff, such as a computer, books, car, cellphone, coffee machine, cup, clothes, desk, table, chair, etc. A piece of paper was never enough to list them all. Then, I started listing people's names that I need to be thankful to. Hundreds of names come out of my mouth; my wife, family, many friends, and many Wesley family and friends. Without those belongings, I couldn't live my life as I have done, and without those people, I couldn't be who I am and who I will be. But I think I haven't expressed a proper appreciation, but taken them for granted. I think it speaks a lot these days in the Pandemic era. I don't know how much I miss being with you, worshipping God with you, and hugging each one of you. I thought it was so natural and took it for granted, but it was indeed so precious.

Then, those lists of my belongings and people's name turn from my gratitude to my confession to people around me, and God. So, I want to say to all of you and the people around me that I'm sorry for taking so many things for granted and that I'm really thankful for your presence in my life. And my confession and gratitude go to God in praying and meditating on the meaning of Jesus' sacrifice in this Lenten season. The weakness of our Protestant belief on God's grace is that we know very well that God's grace, mercy, compassion, and love is given to all of us freely and that we take it for granted. We paid nothing for this priceless grace, but we need to remember that the priceless cost was paid through the life of Jesus, our Lord, and savior for us. Let's pause for a minute and count what we take for granted. And let's give thanks to people around us, particularly the people who are fighting the virus to save so many precious people and the people who continue to run our community with essential businesses. And let us give thank ultimately to our God even in this higher anxiety era.
