I want to share a story and ponder it with you.



A six-year-old boy was heading home from the beach with his four-year-old sister. After a few minutes, he noticed she was no longer beside him. He looked back and saw that she had stopped walking. She was standing in front of a shop window, staring keenly inside. Her brother joined her, peering through the glass.

"Would you like anything?" He asked her. She pointed at a teddy bear. He took her by the hand and pulled her into the shop with him. He looked around the shelves of toys before finding the bear his sister wanted. He lifted it gently and gave it to her. Her little face lit up with joy.

The shopkeeper, an older man, had been watching them closely, smiling. While the girl held the bear in her arms, the boy went to the checkout and asked: "How much for the teddy bear, sir?" The shopkeeper smiled. "Well, what can you afford to pay?" From his pocket, the boy took some shells that he had collected on the beach and placed them on the counter. The shopkeeper began to count them as if they were real money. Then he looked at the boy. The boy asked anxiously: "Is it enough?" The shopkeeper replied, "No, no. This is too much. I'll give you something back." He kept only four shells and gave the rest back to the boy. The boy put the shells back into his pocket, delighted, and went home with his little sister.

An employee had watched the scene and asked the shopkeeper: "That bear was pretty expensive. Did you really just sell it for shells?" The shopkeeper smiled again. "To us, they're just shells. But to that little boy, they are treasured. He does not understand what money is now, but he'll know when he's older. If he remembers that he once bought a toy with shells instead of money, he will still believe in the good things in the world."

Isn't it a beautiful and heartwarming story? I just pictured this scene in my mind, and it made me smile. I have heard from a few people that how frustrated and tired they were in this challenging season. One of them said, "I think I'm almost done with my patience." You know what? I feel exactly the same as you do. And it gives me another perspective to read the story above.

Some people might talk about the number and some scientific information about pandemics in the past and infectious disease patterns. And some people simply underestimate the harm, saying, "it is what it is. No need to be worried." But most of us are afraid and tired of it in this season. It is about the lives of ourselves and our beloved ones. And we are serious like the boy with the shells.

And we read the kindness of the shopkeeper. What caught me was, the shopkeeper said, "He'll know when he's older" "He will still believe in the good things in the world." With this shopkeeper, I thought of God's love and plan for us in this Advent season. And I believe God understands what we are feeling, and I feel confident with God's yearning to listen to us, including crying out for help and security.

The shopkeeper's kindness costs a certain amount of money, but God's love for us costs Jesus Christ, the Incarnation of Godself. Jesus' sacrifice was already planned at the beginning of the first Advent. I think God's hope was, when God sent Jesus, "My beloved one would know how much I love them, and they would know what plan I have." Christ's coming was God's love letter for us. As we have faith in God leading us in this challenging season like Moses' wilderness, we will one day know that God is still present, walking with us, guiding us, and helping move forward with hope in Christ. Amen.
