A few days ago, Facebook reminded me of a napkin's photo written by a little girl that I met at a church after-school program years ago.

. The after-school program offered a brief version of VBS every Thursday: singing and dancing, craft, and exercise. We also provided snacks for them. During snack time, the little 1st-grade girl wrote something down on a napkin and handed it to me with a big smile. It said, "I BLivin in GoD."

You may find typos in her writing, but surely you understand what she was trying to say: "I believe in God." I was overwhelmed with joy, and I couldn't breathe at that moment, shouting "YES! YES! YES!" in my mind. It was the moment I strongly felt God worked in many ways, and even children could feel the love and respond to the love, saying, "I love God and believe in God." I still remember the girl's big smile without two teeth.

We have a forty-day Lenten journey. It is a season we examine ourselves whether we are on the right path with God in our words, deeds, and actions and whether we've made wrong decisions and sin intentionally or unintentionally

Continue from pg.1 And by penitence and by asking for forgiveness and practicing forgiveness, we are restored and reconciled so that we grow in a deeper relationship with God and God's people

And the purpose of this season is very clear. The aim is not to stay in condemnation or judgment, but healing, restoration, and reconciliation, just like we find in John chapter 3. We all love John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that God gave the Only Begotten Son, that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." This is the promise of God for all of us who believe in Jesus Christ. And it continues to talk about judgment. It says, "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be SAVED through him."

The Scripture tells us that what God has interested the most is saving all people with God's unconditional love. It is the promise that God has given us. It is the hope we have in Jesus Christ. It is the power that we have the courage to live our lives by the power of the Holy Spirit. So, the Lenten season's message is that by self-examination, prayers, meditating the Word of God, and the Sacrament, we get reminded again that we are in Christ who is the hope of the world.

The best message I may give to all people in this season is that Jesus understands you and me. You may not be able to find anyone who can understand what you are feeling and what you are going through. But Jesus understands you. And I will preach about how and why he understands us in this Lenten season. And the thing is, Jesus binds us all in this beautiful church, Wesley United Methodist Church so that we walk together humbly with God and one another. As we remember God's love and find God's presence in our lives, we witness the living God among us, and we say, "We BLivin in GoD." Amen.

...and contemplate simplicity.


...and be prayerful.


