FROM OUR PASTOR

It's April. We celebrate Jesus' resurrection, and I'd like to revisit the meaning of Easter. We focused on what happened to Jesus from the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday until his crucifixion on Good Friday during the Lenten season. While meditating and preparing sermons, I kept asking one question, "What did Jesus feel?"

He seemed to know that Judas would betray him. His disciples, who had followed him and learned from him for three years, still didn't get it, and they were debating which one of them was the greatest, just a few hours before he was arrested. What did Jesus feel? All of his disciples scattered except Peter, but he's also hiding from people, denying knowing Jesus three times. What did Jesus feel? The Son of God was put on trial for blasphemy before Jewish religious leaders and people shouted, 'Crucify him.' What did Jesus feel? He spoke a few words on the cross, which we all know. His words touched my heart with that question again, "What did Jesus feel?"

He said, 'Father, forgive them for they know not what they do.' The pain, sorrow, and humiliation he experienced was still present sentence when he spoke this word. He was still suffering nearly to death on his cross. Jewish leaders were taunting him, and Roman soldiers were mocking him and gambling for his clothing at his feet. (cont.on p2)

It seemed everything was over. There were a large number of the crowd who had dreamed of political independence through Jesus' leadership and who had hoped for a better world with enough food on their table. Their expectancy became in vain with Jesus on his cross. Some of them were weeping, and some were cursing him. At that moment, Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them for they know not what they do.'

His last word was 'It is finished.' What was finished? What was it Jesus pursued even on his cross? What was that for? Wasn't it forgiveness? I think it is about forgiveness, forgiveness for love. Jesus came down for our salvation, which is forgiveness and restoration. I believe Jesus knew what he was doing, and he was clear about what he hoped to happen among his people. That's why he endured all his suffering on his cross. It is like a sprout coming up in the spring, shouting, "I'm still alive. It was harsh winter with cold weather and heavy snowstorm. It looked like everything could not survive in it. But I've gone through harsh and dark moments, and I'm alive, and I'm going to bloom again." Isn't it what Jesus was hoping for?

And it was not just his mission. When his disciples were debating on the Last Supper, which one was the greatest, Jesus said, "Do you not understand what I have done for you?" I think Jesus is still asking us this question after Easter. It is a message and example for us. Giving us an example of forgiveness and unconditional love on his cross, Jesus is asking us to forgive and love so that we may overcome our dark moment in our lives and get restored and bloom again in Jesus

This April, we will be talking about forgiveness. Let's be honest! Forgiveness is hard. Why is it so hard? What is it that makes us so unforgiving of ourselves and each other? We'll take an honest, realistic look at how to seek, extend and accept forgiveness. Amen.


I am very appreciative of all the love and support from our congregation. The cards and visits at the window are so uplifting and keep a smile on my face.


