so grateful and excited thinking about it. Then, I heard the news from CNN that a new variant, Omicron, was the dominant variant in the States. I was going to talk about our Wesley family's dream, thinking of emerging from the Pandemic. I was going to encourage more gatherings and empower our ministries. Then, the news made me numb.

While discerning what to do with the current context, what came to my mind was that it is time we think more of God's dream in our lives and community. This Pandemic has been long enough that many people have been stressed, frustrated, and drained. Many frontline workers quit their jobs because of the high level of stress and burden. It's happening in many places. And I believe it is the time we need to think of dreaming God's dream and find God's calling in our context.

Day after day, we sometimes find ourselves not knowing where we are heading and for what we are running. Then, I believe that's the moment we need to take a pause and think about it. Each one of us has a different location, different position, different responsibilities, and different goals. We Christians believe that God knows us by our names and that God has a special plan for each one of us. Then, God's plan should be bigger than what we can imagine. God's plan could be something we found long ago, but now we forget. Or we know God's plan for us, but need to be reminded.

At the beginning of this year, I'd like to encourage you to think of your dream, goal, and purpose, which God puts in your life, and of how your dream may extend and influence your family, your communities, your church, and this world. In January, let's think of our dream and listen to the nudging of the Holy Spirit with a question, "What is a God-sized mission in my life?" I have already started praying for this sermon series and your journey. Would you be willing to join me?

Happy New Year! May God bless you and lead you in your journey. Amen.


"After Advent Class" for Children during 10am Worship begins January 9th for kids aged preschool – 6th grade!
