From Our Pastor...

What Is God Doing?

Let me confess to you. I've been under a kind of disease. Actually, it's been a while with me, almost twenty years. I try to overcome it. Sometimes I'm better, but it's not easy. Then, I heard that most pastors and some Christians also have the same symptoms. There is no particular medical terminology for that, so I call that "a sermon writing syndrome."

So, here is what it is. When I read the Bible, the syndrome leads me to see it with a particular purpose in an intentional approach. Even with a single verse of the Bible, I find myself automatically seeking some messages to me. I want it to speak to me what I need to do or not to do in my own life, asking, "God, what do you want me to do?" I think that's good in many ways. We have to ask God every day and try to be the person for whom God created us to be, and we really want to know how we may respond to a specific happening in a Christian manner. And that's a kind of reasonable approach to finding a point of my sermon. But, sometimes, I feel that I'm sometimes missing.

Then, I currently read a book written by a great theologian of our time, N.T. Wright. He introduces Missional Hermeneutic with three questions: What is God doing? What is God's mission (or goal) in the text or context? How does God want God's people to participate in God's mission? When I talk about "a sermon writing syndrome," it is so much about questions number 2 and 3, missing number 1. But N. T. Wright says that numbers 2 and 3 are driven by number 1, but we Christians, particularly pastors for their sermon writing, often miss the first one. He asks us to focus on God instead of ourselves, and it brings me a huge "Aha" moment.

March 29th <u>Worship Team Meeting</u>7:00pm (Fellowship Hall) It is like, when we read the Bible, the question is not all about what God wants me to do, but what God is doing and what is God's goal in that particular text or chapter? It is a simple question, "What is God doing?" But it brings a considerable change. The main character is not a particular figure in the Bible but God.

For instance, I thought the main figure of the Exodus was Moses and Joshua and that God was like the film director telling them what to do or like a GPS saying, "Moses, turn left in 2 miles." But with missional hermeneutic, God is not the film director outside the scene telling them what to do, but God is the one who leads God's people in that particular scene in the background. Interesting, right?


That is so right. We sing a hymn In the Garden, "He walks with me, and He talks with me, and He tells me I am His own." That means God is doing something with us in our lives. But what we ask God, when we pray and read the Bible, is so much focused on us only and less about God. And when I read the Bible and start asking, "God, what are you doing there?" the story unfolds a new angle of the scene with some other insights in which God is actually working as a main figure of the scene.

In this season of Lent, we reflect our hearts, examine our patterns of life, and commit ourselves to Christ. It is like we are tuning ourselves to God. In this season, why don't we ask the first question of missional hermeneutic, "What is God doing?" What is God doing in the Scripture I'm reading? What is God doing in my life? What is God doing in my family, neighborhood, and church? May God reveals Godself to us, and we see, feel and sense God in our faith journey. Amen.


