A while ago, I had a meeting with some clergies, and we discussed the church's goal. Our basic premise started with "Making disciples of Jesus Christ and changing the world" according to the Book of Discipline. Then, our conversation was extended to a further question, "What does it mean to be disciples of Jesus Christ?" The discussion was all about being Christians and the three senses of Grace: Prevenient Grace, Justifying Grace and Sanctifying

A pastor presented her belief in being a Christian in an approach to making a relationship in a community. She shared her experience in a new membership class. She asked people, "What if a person reads the Bible every day and praises hymns alone in a room? Can we say this person is a Christian?" Many people replied, "Yes!" But the answer was, "Might be yes, but mostly No!" because a person cannot be a church alone, unless the person is located alone in the middle of a desert or jungle since Christ declares that a church is a gathering of people in their practices of faith by making a relationship with each other and making actions as Jesus' disciples into the world. We can be a God-fearer by doing practices of faith alone, not Christians without a community.

Then, another pastor added her belief of being a church in a progressive approach to being Apostles. She made her classification on differences between Jesus' followers, disciples, and apostles. When we profess that we love God and Jesus, we become Jesus-followers. It is the starting point of our faith. Then, by living by God's will, making a relationship with God and our neighbors, and reaching out to the world, we become disciples of Jesus Christ. But there is the next step after being disciples; being apostles. We need to keep on our faith journey until we become apostles of Jesus Christ. It is like a process of being justified, sanctified, and whole in Christ.

We had a sermon series on Methodist Heritage through John Wesley a while ago. It is all about what Jesus has taught us to live on our faith journey. We are Easter people. We are people of faith in the resurrection, in which Jesus proves that Christ completed all his missions on earth for us and that we, children of God, are all invited to God's love and grace. Easter is a truly defining story.

Let's question ourselves: "What does it mean to be children of God?" and "How can we live on the Gospel Jesus gives to each of us?" We will have a sermon series with a book, "Purpose Driven Life, " to find our answers." With this series, I like to invite you to meditate with me on these questions and keep trying to live by Gospel. May God bless you and help you find your answers. Amen.
