

Once Jesus asked them, 'Who do the crowds say that I am?' They answered, 'John the Baptist; but others, Elijah; and still others, that one of the ancient prophets has arisen.' He said to them, 'But who do

you say that I am?' Peter answered, 'The Messiah of God.'

(Luke 9:18~20:NRSV)

We had a serious sermon a while ago with one question, "Who do you say that I am?" We talked about Jesus with a couple of questions in finding our answer to Jesus' question. Who is Jesus? What does his message mean? What does it mean to us in the 21st century?

We have four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. Each one delivers vivid images of Jesus Christ, and each has different views and angles on Jesus. Once we come close to each Gospel, we will have a rich understanding of Jesus with so much inspiration, and it will bring a huge change in our lives, and we claim Jesus is Christ the Lord in our faith journey.

I like to take a journey to explore the stories of Jesus with the Gospel of Luke. Luke has unique perspectives on Jesus and the people around Jesus. Let me tell you a little bit about Luke's Gospel. Luke's Gospel is the first of a two-volume set, and the book of Acts is the second. Luke was Apostle Paul's mission trip companion. Paul describes Luke in Colossians 4:14 that he was the beloved physician. He was highly educated and fluent in Greek.

Both Luke's Gospel and the book of Acts were written to the same person, The most excellent Theophilus. The most excellent Theophilus was a formal greeting of someone in a very high position. So, the recipient could be the Emperor of the Roman Empire. At the same time, it could represent all who love God since the Greek word, Theophilus, means "Love of God." It was written to you and me.

Aren't you curious that Luke wants to speak to us about Jesus Christ? Luke has very different perspectives on Jesus and his followers, and we find people to whom other Gospels don't pay full attention. Luke tries to pay attention to their voices and enlighten us about their precious value and talent. It could be ordinary people's stories, just like you and me.

My hope and prayer are that we may find true meaning and inspiration from the Holy Spirit during this journey. Would you like to take this journey with me?

Reminders


The "gratitude board" still has room to post a tribute to person(s) for which you are grateful.


