



In February we collected \$434.38 for Grace Children's Hospital & Pediatric Clinic in Haiti.


Additionally, members donated \$1,070 for UMCOR to be used for earthquake relief in Syria and Turkey.

Wesley has always been a mission-minded church. The purpose of this space is to keep the congregation informed of our various mission efforts.

We currently are receiving:

- Donations of bedding, small appliances, and other household items to support Trinity UMC and the VA Clinic/ Valor Program, as they work to find homes for local veterans. A list of needed items is on the table in the fellowship hall.
- March's collection for local pantries is toilet paper.
- Travel-sized toiletries for the Trinity and FISH pantries continue to be collected.
- Loose coins for March will benefit Midwest Mission Distribution Center. The Center is located just east of Chatham, IL and opened in March of 2000. Since then, this resource has distributed disaster relief items to at least 21 states and 29 countries. It is a cooperating depot serving the UMCOR Relief Supply Network.
