From Our Pastor...

Community Care Team

I have been talking about the four aspects/purposes of the church since last year, during sermons, leadership training, small groups, and in the Chimes newsletter. These four aspects are: Kerygma (the Word of God), Didache (Education), Diakonia (Service), and Koinonia (Fellowship). - Please find the Chimes of July and August 2022. Please find the chart below to recognize what Wesley family does in four areas - These essential elements define a community as the body of Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit, in alignment with our denominational mission statement to make disciples of Jesus Christ and transform the world.

Emerging from the pandemic, we have made significant progress and growth in various areas of ministry. Teams and committees have revisited their job descriptions and reestablished a collective rhythm of effort to revitalize our church's ministry. I express my utmost gratitude to all the leaders and team members for their dedication. There is one more action we are taking to deepen our faith in action and serve our local community, aligning with the four aspects of the church.

An initiative to create the Community Care Team was approved by the Administrative Council earlier this year. In March 20, seven of us gathered to brainstorm and shape the team, sharing numerous excellent ideas to serve the local community. I would like to share the team's decisions and how we plan to expand our circle of ministry. *Continued on page 2...*

Firstly, we have decided to launch an informative team that provides opportunities to serve the local community. Instead of creating individual ministries such as food pantries, thrift shops, or specific services like afterschool programs or Buddy Bags, the team will gather information and invite people to participate in collective work. The group has identified ten opportunities: 1) Fish Food Pantry & Breakfast Program, 2) Domestic Violence, 3) CGH Hospital Volunteer, 4) CGH Foundation, 5) School Mentoring Program, 6) Afterschool Program, 7) Habitat for Humanity, 8) Reynoldswood Camp, 9) United Way, and 10) Houses and Small Churches. We are currently compiling brief information about these ten ministry opportunities and will soon create a flyer and a board in the Fellowship Hall. The next step will involve scheduling one or two service projects on a regular basis, perhaps once a month or every other month. The group has also discussed the possibility of a future mission trip.

You may be curious about the last opportunity mentioned, Houses and Small Churches. This initiative will build upon an existing program of some churches called NOMADS. Some of our Wesley members have already helped repair their neighbors' houses, with the homeowners providing materials while they meet maintenance needs. Similarly, some small local churches face challenges in maintaining their aging buildings due to a shortage of trustees and resources. In this case, the church will provide materials, and a group of people will assist with their maintenance needs. Even helping one church per year would provide significant support and enable the small church to continue serving its community. For this project, we may collaborate with other churches in our county or district to form a group.

During the Wesley Leadership Training earlier this year, I introduced a Latin word that encapsulates what we do as a faith community—Leiturgia. It literally means "service and work for the people," derived from the words "laos" (people) and "ergon" (work). The early church embraced this concept in their ministry, serving one another, the community of faith, and the local community. **Continued on pg.3**


We share very sad news with our Wesley family of the passing of Jeff Cedro.
