For the past decade, I've been studying the trends among young people in relation to the church, given that the Millennial and Gen Z generations (MZ generations) are the least engaged in religious gatherings. My premise is that the church can learn from why young people are disengaging and what they desire from the church. By doing so, we can become a more missional church, embodying the essence of the body of Jesus Christ.

I'd like to share with our Wesley family what young generations hope for from their church. Once you hear their expectations, you'll likely find yourself nodding in agreement. Firstly, many young people desire a church that holds not only meaning but also practical applicability, in essence, a relevant church. We, as a church, need to be willing to transcend traditional boundaries and actively engage with the ever-evolving world in a meaningful manner.

Secondly, the younger generation hopes for an authentic and transparent church that serves as a vital sanctuary for exploring faith without the fear of judgment, as they often perceive the church as judgmental. Thirdly, the MZ generations highly value diversity and actively seek a church that wholeheartedly embraces individual differences and promotes equality. Lastly, just like other generations, MZ generations long for integral and meaningful relationships and a genuine community founded on radical hospitality.

Relevance, authenticity, transparency, inclusivity, and hospitality – are those not what we all desire from the church? Among all the aspects of the beauty of Jesus Christ' church, radical hospitality stands out as the key. It offers a safe and inclusive space, breaking down barriers and doubts, and nurturing a profound and mutual community where everyone feels valued and embraced. Incorporating radical hospitality into our spiritual DNA is crucial, as it aligns with God's unconditional love exemplified through Jesus Christ's incarnation and resurrection. This love restores our relationship with God and all God's people, sparking the birth of the church, the body of Jesus Christ.

We are incredibly blessed to have a wonderful faith community, Wesley United Methodist Church. Let's continue to journey together, guided and empowered by the Holy Spirit. Let's cultivate hospitality among us and manifest God's hospitality through our love for neighbors within our church, local community, country, and the world. Does this seem like an enormous task? I hope you don't feel overwhelmed, as God walks beside us, leading and empowering us on this journey. Our main responsibility is to walk with God in love. We will do this together. Amen.


