Greetings, Sterling Wesley family. I feel led to share some thoughts on the Bible and encourage you, focusing on the transformative power of God's Word. One of my favorite Bible verses is 2 Timothy 3:16a: "All Scripture

is inspired by God."

This passage beautifully encapsulates the divine origin and profound purpose of the Bible. Every Word in the Bible is not a dead fossil written for people thousands of years ago only. It is God-breathed, offering us wisdom, guidance, and correction. Dear Sterling Wesley family,

I've served the General Conference as a Page & Marshal team leader, leading about 150 volunteers who helped create a safe environment with integrity and accountability at the Conference. It was my honor and privilege to witness and serve the General Conference as a leader, and I fell in deeper love with our church and denomination.



As United Methodists, we profoundly understand grace – God's boundless, unmerited love and care for each of us. John Wesley emphasized that grace is freely available to all and essential for all. Our journey as a faith community is rooted in growing in grace, embodying it in our daily lives, and sharing it with others. This is the heart of our faith and ministry: living by grace and extending it to everyone we encounter. Our hope lies in God's ability to renew and transform us through grace.

I want to share the part many people are most interested in among the more than a thousand petitions. The recent decisions at the General Conference reflect our commitment to these core beliefs. Removing exclusive language regarding LGBTQ+ weddings and ordination from our Book of Discipline marks a significant step forward. No longer must our clergy fear mandatory penalties on officiating LGBTQ+ weddings as it was abolished. This change brings us back to the inclusive spirit that existed before 1972. Additionally, the definition of marriage now encompasses diverse family structures, recognizing unions between a man and a woman or two consenting adults.

Here are a few things to share about the changes. (The G.C. and Bishop Schwerin)

- No one needs to be afraid of losing their clergy credentials for performing same-gender weddings.
- Clergy can choose to perform same-gender weddings or choose not to.
- Local church Trustees can decide what kinds of weddings they wish to host in their buildings.
- Clergy will be appointed in the ways based on stated needs for the mission and gifts to match those needs. Appointments will not be made to do harm to our ministry.

The General Conference proceeded with great peace and became a venue for unity between progressives and conservatives. By arriving at conclusions that go beyond extreme conflict and division and include both perspectives, we affirmed that our highest value and primary goal is discipleship.

Bishop Dan Schwerin and his cabinet acknowledge that these changes may cause grief and concerns for some traditionally theological communities while others are rejoicing. With this acknowledgment, the bishop assures his support for their concerns and ministries. It is crucial to dispel any misinformation suggesting that individuals will be punished for their beliefs or actions, urging all of us to strive to honor and support all persons and fostering a community where we can collectively work toward making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the World. Our diversity enriches our ministry and extends our reach to those who may not yet know the hope of the resurrection.

You are also invited to visit my office to discuss any concerns or questions you may have. Let us continue to embrace grace and unity as we move forward.


