

There is something more. At the lobby, our kids will write their permission slips for the registration. While waiting our turn, we will watch other people flying and indirectly learn what it would be like. Before flying, we will be invited to watch a training video and learn directly from an instructor. After the instruction, we will wear a spacesuit and sit on the bench waiting for our turn. Just a few minutes before the flight, we will feel our hearts beating fast with excitement. Finally, the instructor will hold us and help us fly in the air. It will be amazing. I bet our confirmands will make a wonderful flight.

There is an information sheet on a wall about the level of flight. I will talk to our confirmands about the levels. After their first flight, they will receive a flight certificate with their names on it. That is the first level. On the second flight, you still need an instructor to fly, but you can fly to the top of the ceiling. That's the second level. After a couple of times of skydiving, you can finally fly by yourself at the third level. At the final level, you can teach your friends how to fly and help them fly. Isn't it just like our faith journey?

We have someone who brought us into the church and helped us feel and learn about God. With their help and examples of love, we tasted what it is to believe in God and belong to a community of faith. We decide to be a faithful follower of Jesus Christ, and then we tell people about God and the faith community. I think it is a beautiful journey with one another. I pray that our confirmands will feel God's love and Wesley family's support.



The General Conference of the United Methodist Church serves as the highest legislative body, akin to a United Nations General Assembly, where decisions impacting millions of members globally are made. Scheduled every four years, the recent session, postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, is set for April 23-May 3 in Charlotte, North Carolina, arriving after an eight-year hiatus since the last assembly in 2016.

This assembly holds significant importance, given recent developments, including the departure of a quarter of U.S. churches under a disaffiliation policy. The General Conference shapes policy by revising the denomination's governing documents, the Book of Discipline and the Book of Resolutions, and approving the budget for denomination-wide ministries. Delegates, half clergy and half lay, from across continents, present and vote on legislation proposed by various United Methodist entities or individuals.

The assembly's agenda includes electing members to key denominational bodies and addressing pressing issues facing the church. Despite the global scope, the majority of delegates hail from the U.S., with efforts made to ensure diverse representation and language support. Bishops, though without voting rights, play a ceremonial role and provide spiritual guidance.

Worship is integral to the conference, opening and closing each day's proceedings and punctuating key moments. Delegates engage in prayerful discernment as they deliberate over legislation, which typically requires a simple majority for passage. However, amendments to the denomination's constitution demand a two-thirds majority, followed by approval from annual conferences.

Once ratified, legislation enacted at the General Conference takes effect the following January, with constitutional amendments necessitating additional validation by the Council of Bishops. In essence, the General Conference serves as the crucible wherein the future trajectory and ethos of the United Methodist Church are forged, reflecting its commitment to democratic governance, inclusivity, and fidelity to its core principles and mission.
