I want to reflect on radical hospitality and divine friendship inspired by Henri Nouwen's teachings. What does radical hospitality mean to you? When have you felt truly welcomed and valued? How do these experiences shape your understanding of God's love?

Henri Nouwen spoke of hospitality as more than just opening our homes; it is about opening our hearts by creating a safe space and welcoming others into our circle of life. This form of hospitality invites us to create spaces where people feel safe, valued, heard, and valued, transcending social and personal boundaries.

Practicing radical hospitality, we nurture divine friendship, mirroring God's unconditional love and acceptance. Jesus exemplified this through his incarnation and interactions with others, offering fellowship and friendship to all. This love breaks down barriers and fosters deeper connections. Martin Luther King Jr. said, "Hate cannot drive out Hate, but only love can do. Darkness cannot drive out darkness, but only light." It echoes, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1:5). With God's hospitality that urges us to build friendship, let us break down barriers, and foster deeper connections.

With an upcoming sermon series on hospitality and friendship, let us nurture our hospitality and build friendship. May God guide us in embodying God's love, which can transform our world into one of genuine acceptance and authentic love.




