One of the Major Discussion at the NIC Annual Conference

At this year's Annual Conference, one of the most important topics we're discussing is called **regional***ization*. It may sound complicated, but it's actually about making sure our United Methodist Church can better reflect the diversity of people and cultures across the world—while staying united in our mission.

The idea behind **regionalization** is simple: the world is big and different, and not every church can or should operate in exactly the same way. For many years, most church decisions have been made with the United States in mind. This has sometimes made it hard for people in other parts of the world—like Africa, Europe, or the Philippines—to feel equally represented. With this new plan, every region would have more say in decisions that affect their ministry. That means each area, including the U.S., could adapt some of our rules (like parts of the Book of Resolution) to fit their own culture and context.

For example, some petitions that come before the General Conference—like ones about American politics, investment strategies, or social issues—only apply to churches in the U.S. But almost half of the delegates who vote come from outside the U.S. These faithful delegates often have to vote on matters that may not relate to their communities at all. And the same goes the other way—churches in Africa or Asia sometimes face very different challenges, and their needs can get lost in the process.

Another reason regionalization is important is because not every region has the same access to education or resources. For instance, in some places, people preparing to become pastors do not have access to the same level of formal theological education as we do here. It's not fair to expect exactly the same standards when the circumstances are so different. Regionalization gives each area the flexibility to set policies that are faithful to God's calling *and* realistic in their context. There are practical benefits, too. Financially, regionalization could reduce the cost and complexity of our worldwide decision-making processes by allowing more decisions to be made locally.

Let me be clear: this is *not* about breaking the church apart. The goal is to stay united in heart and mission, while giving each part of the church room to grow in its own way. In fact, it might even help us save resources by reducing unnecessary conflicts and focusing more on local ministry.

Of course, some people are concerned that this plan could make our church feel less connected or cause confusion about what we believe. Others worry it could be hard to manage or may lead to uneven expectations. These are real concerns, and they remind us to move forward carefully and prayerfully.

Still, I believe this plan offers us a hopeful path—one where our church becomes more just, more flexible, and more faithful in every corner of the world. Let's continue to be in prayer for wisdom, unity, and courage as we live into this new season of ministry together.
