

Pastor's Reflections

I don't usually plan my columns months in advance, but I did for this one. This month, the United Methodist Church will meet for a special session of our General Conference to see if we can find "a way forward" over the deep divisions within the UMC over how LGBTQ (Lesbian, Gay, Bi-Sexual, Transgender, and Queer) should be active within our denomination and what leadership roles LQBTQ person should play within the UMC. Thousands, perhaps millions of words have been written on this over the past several months, and I am not going to try and summarize it all here. I can't predict what might happen at this General Conference and if it will have a major impact on Sterling Wesley United Methodist Church. I truly don't know what will happen, no one really does. It is my hope whatever happens will be guided by the Holy Spirit, but I also sadly know humans don't always follow what the Holy Spirit urges us to do.

However, I want to draw on something our Bishop, Sally Dyck said last summer, something that I have been pondering and seeking to live into since I heard it. The mission statement of the United Methodist Church is: "Making Disciples of Jesus Christ for the Transformation of the World." That is a statement I am behind 100 percent! Becoming a disciple, a follower of Jesus Christ, and building my life around his two key teachings to love God with all I am and love my neighbor as myself has changed my life. I believe that in Christ, God came into this world to offer us relationship and life worth living; in Christ, God even suffered because God loves us all that much. Being a disciple of Jesus Christ has given my life purpose and meaning, and I want to share that with others. I also believe Christ calls us to help change our world. To end the systems that lead to injustice, poverty, racism, sexism, bigotry, prejudice, abuse, neglect, and all the other brokenness in our world. All the miseries caused by human sin. All the sinful systems that inflict suffering, particularly suffering on the innocent.

An inter-generational team of people (youth and adults of various ages) will be going on a mission trip to Tree of Life Ministries, in Mission, SD (on the Rosebud Reservation, Lakota Nation) from July 20-28. We want you to be part of that team!

Tree of Life has been around since the 1980s and provides home repair, education, community development, nutrition and health services, and economic opportunity in Jesus' Name to their community. Sadly for many reasons, Rosebud Reservation is one of the most economically depressed regions of the US. Also sadly many people who claimed to be acting in Jesus name have over the past 120 years not always acted with ethics, mercy, and love towards the Lakota people Tree of Life seeks to witness for Jesus through acts of love, support, and justice seeking to improve the lives of those in the Rosebud community.

Our mission team will be engaging specifically in home and building repair, ministries that help provide food and fellowship to the elderly, and also helping with a thrift shop. (also if anyone with medical skills wants to there may be some special opportunities for you to use your skills to help with some public health initiatives.) Each evening we will have time to learn more about Lakota culture. We will visit the beautiful Black Hills and get to know the people of the community. Anyone going into 7th grade can come on the trip (a younger person might be able to if their parents plan to come as well.) As of the writing of this article we have 10 people who've expressed interest, and we can take up to 9 more people with us, so sign up today.

The cost of the trip per person, including transportation, food, the building supplies and lodging while there will be \$500.00. That may seem like a lot, but we are not expecting people to pay that all out of pocket and we plan to do extensive fundraising. If you are interested please put down a \$50.00 deposit (or as much of that as you can) by March 1.

I know not all people will be able to go on the trip for many reasons, schedules, health, etc. However, I ask each person in the congregation to consider if they could make even a small donation towards the trip. We can be a team going out from Wesley to help people in Jesus Name. We can all be part of that! So let team up Wesley and see what God can do through us this summer!

Whatever happens within and or to our denomination, I ask you all to prayerfully consider how you can help make disciples of Jesus Christ (and it might be that you are right now making yourself into a disciple a follower of Jesus) and how you can help transform our world for the better in Jesus' Name. I believe this mission is something we are doing, that we can do better, and is worthwhile. I pray that Wesley can continue to live out this mission, even more faithfully and more perfectly with the Holy Spirit as our guide. May it be so in Jesus' Name, Amen.
